Radiant Futures builds a safer community by providing crisis support, services for all survivors, and education to prevent domestic violence and trafficking.

Our Story

Originally founded as Women's Transitional Living Center, we were the first domestic violence agency in Orange County and the third in the United States. For over 48 years, we've been a committed partner and solid presence in our community. Our work continues to evolve as we provide inclusive, comprehensive services to everyone impacted by domestic violence and human trafficking.

Our Approach

BRIDGE HOUSING

Immediate, long-term, and permanent housing options, and pets are welcome.



Housed **321** survivors, their families, and **12** pets were housed in our shelter program, for a total of **20,491** bed-nights.

COUNSELING

Psychotherapy services for survivors, children, and individuals who have caused harm.



Provided **772** counseling sessions to adults and children totaling **2,425 hours** of mental health services.

LEGAL

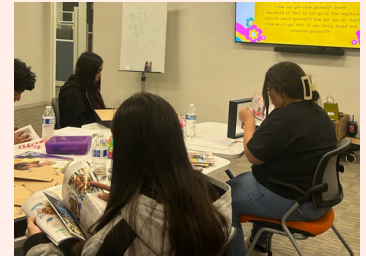
DOJ accredited services for survivors seeking legal information around family law and immigration.



Supported **283** clients with legal advocacy services and **54** clients with immigration advocacy services.

COMMUNITY

Presentations, trainings, supervised visitation, and support groups for all ages to promote safety.



Educated **1,342** community members, taught **459** survivors, trained **53** professionals on DV and HT, and supervised **240** visits.

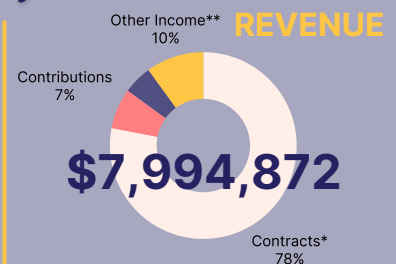
